
PPG.....

What's that?



PPG stands for Pupil Premium Grant

What is it?



The pupil premium is additional funding given to schools by the government. This funding is to help schools close the attainment gap between children from low income families and other disadvantaged families and their peers.


The school has to publish its strategy about how this funding is spent and what the impact is. You can find our PPG Strategy on the school website.



Who is eligible for PPG?



- If you are registered as receiving a benefit that entitles you to Free School Meals (FSM)
- Looked after children
- Children adopted from care or who have left care
- Children of families who are in service (e.g. the army)
- Ever 6 FSM. This means children who have received free school meals at any point in the last 6 years.




My child has a free school meal, does that mean they are eligible for PPG?




Since September 2014, all children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 have qualified for free school meals regardless of their family income.

From April 2018, free school meals and pupil premium is only allocated to pupils with a family income under £7400 (net) per year.

If your child qualifies for free school meals, it's important that you tell us at school - even if they take a packed lunch - as this enables the school to claim pupil premium.



How can PPG help me and my family?






We will look at each child on a case by case basis. Please come in and tell us if you have any financial concerns about your child taking part in any school trips and activities or if there are particular resources that your child might need.



What does that mean for my child?



- one free afterschool club each term
- participation in local community and sporting events
- swimming lessons in Year 6 for those pupils who have yet to meet the expected end
 of Key Stage 2 standards for swimming
- a contribution towards all class trips, educational visits and experiences to enhance your child's learning, including residential trips in Year 5 and 6
