Make a travel brochure about Ancient Egypt. Where would you stay? What could you do while you were there? Who would you recommend to visit? Use pictures with lots of facts and information.		The Pharaoh's gods Ramesses II, Tutankhamun and Cleopatra decided to go for a walk, two at a time. How many different combinations of 2 Pharaoh's could walk together at once?		Can you create your own Pharaoh's headdress? Draw your design on paper, then if you would like to, create a 3D version.	
Create a diary entry for an Egyptian Pharaoh of your choice.		Take 5 fruit or vegetables and use kitchen scales to weigh each one. Which one was the heaviest? Record your findings in a table.		Research and follow an Egyptian recipe and take pictures of your creation. Get your family to taste it and write a review.	
Create an information leaflet explaining to young children why they should eat healthily.		Go shopping with an adult and work out how much the ingredients for your favourite meal would be. Write down all the prices and then add them up.		Create a piece of Egyptian art using any materials you like! For example, tomb paintings.	
<b>Challenge activity</b> Write a newspaper report about the discovery of Egyptian jewellery. Try and include all the features we learnt about in school. E.g. headline.		<b>Challenge activity</b> Write three division word problems linked to Egyptians. E.g. Sharing 33 Egyptian beads between 3 children.		<b>Challenge activity</b> Can you create a warm up for a PE lesson which we could try in school? It could include jumping, skipping or something different.
