**Year 1 Homework Takeaway Tasks Farm to Fork Summer 1**

Find a flower, plant or tree you find interesting. Can you describe it? Remember to use adjectives. Think about what it looks like, smells like and feels like.	What is: 5 groups of 2?    4 groups of 10? 3 groups of 5?    2 groups of 2? 4 groups of 10?   5 groups of 5? Use counters, sweets, dried pasta to help you.	Pick 3-5 fruit/veg/dairy products from your fridge. Can you find out which country they came from? If they were produced in our country, which part are they from? (Look at the label). Draw and write your findings.
Practise writing these tricky words in rainbow colours: Water, where, who, work, thought, through, again, mouse.	Grab a handful of counters, sweets, dried pasta etc. Count them out. Share them between you and 1 other family member. Do you both have equal amounts? Do the same with 3 members of your family and 4 too.	Ask your grandparents what they favourite snacks were when they were children. Compare them to your favourite snacks. Write your answers down or draw a picture.

Which character did you like best and why? Can you act out the noisy part of the story?	Make a sandwich and cut it in half. How many parts do you have? Now cut each half into half again. How many part do you have now? Do you know what these are called? Can you halve each part again? What are these called?	Go out on a local walk and find some different types of flowers and trees. Take photos of them. Do you know what they are called? How are they similar and how are they different?
<b>Challenge activity</b> Write a fact file about your favourite farm animal. What do they look like? What do they eat? What are they used on a farm for?	<b>Challenge activity</b> Make a fractions pizza. You can do this on paper or make a real pizza. Divide your pizza into 4 quarters. What ingredient will you put on each quarter? Write how much of your pizza has each ingredient.	<b>Challenge activity</b> Create a model farm. Use old boxes, paper, lego or draw your own fantasy farm. What animals will you have? What will you use to make each of them? Take a picture of your farm and post it on Seesaw.
